## ***Cummings Electrical Receives 2012 IEC/CNA Safety Award***

Supervisors receive training and coaching through an in-house training program so they can instruct fellow employees on trade specific safety topics. The company also operates a Project Risk Observation Plan which evaluates a project and assigns a risk score before it begins, which allows management to assign high risk jobs more safety support. In addition, management has demonstrated their commitment to safety through continuous funding of new Safety Orientation videos; investing in new training for emerging markets; and requiring highly effective safety meetings and training classes.

The IEC/CNA Safety Award is given to electrical and systems contractors who place safety as a high priority in their organization and have the results to prove it. The award is given in five categories: Category 1 – up to 15 employees; Category 2 – 16 to 50 employees; Category 3 – 51 to 125 employees; Category 4 – 126 to 300 employees; and Category 5 – more than 300 employees.
